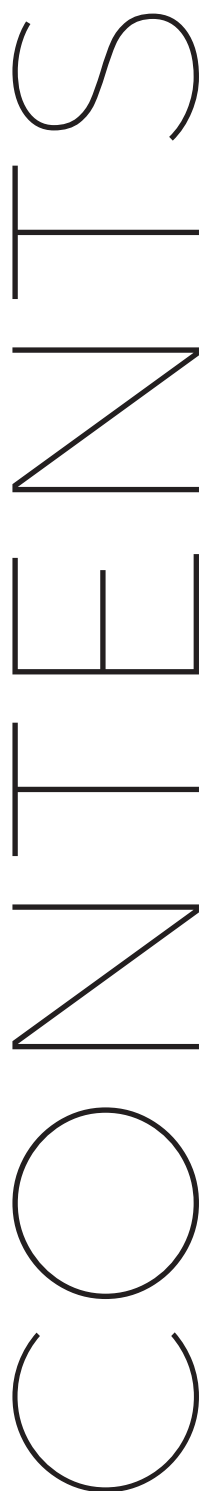

## 02 PRESIDENT ADDRESS

Good evening, everyone, and welcome to the Waverley Tennis 2023 Annual General Meeting, a significant one for me personally because, as announced to you all recently, this will be the last time that I will chair a Waverley Tennis Annual General Meeting, having recently announced that I am not standing for re-election at this Annual General Meeting.

As I said in my recent open letter to you all, it has been a great journey for me over these past 44 years, being the sole survivor from Day 1 of Waverley Tennis, from its foundation in July 1979, to the present time, and I have been very privileged to have headed up (without challenge) the No. 1 Tennis Association in Australia for such a long period.

Returning to the year just past, and leaving the COVID-19 era behind us, it has been another year jam packed with tennis inter-club competitions right across the board – at weekends, at nights, during the weekdays with the Mid-Week Men's and Mid-Week Ladies' Division comps, and then the Hot Shots Match Play on Sunday mornings during the school terms - coupled with tournaments, junior development squad activities and many opportunities for our younger players to represent Waverley Tennis in inter-association events and challenges and to further their young tennis careers.

It can be truly said that Waverley Tennis caters for all ages and all levels (standards) of community tennis with a variety of activities, and proudly has done so since Day 1.

I have again been very fortunate to have been blessed with having a very hard-working volunteer Waverley Tennis Committee of Management, an equally dedicated volunteer Mid-Week Ladies' Division Executive and many other volunteers who have been part of the many Committees and Sub-Committees that form an integral part of the Waverley Tennis administrative team. I thank each and every one of them for their dedicated contribution to Waverley Tennis over this past year. It is unwise for me to start singling out individual officers as all the team would get a special mention and the list would be a very long one.

We did lose our Association Secretary, Olivia Ross, early in 2023 as Olivia just found that her business career did not allow her sufficient time to do justice to the position of Association Secretary and our Assistant Secretary, Ian Chanter, has been acting in this role until Waverley Tennis can recruit a fulltime replacement for Olivia. Thanks, Ian, for all your great efforts in filling in for Olivia over these past several months. We did also accept the services of a former Waverley Tennis Association Treasurer, Lindsay Coster, to a position of Association Bookkeeper to strengthen our efforts in the area of Waverley Tennis finances. Thanks Lindsay.

The Waverley Tennis Website, Facebook and Mailchimp have again provided you all with updated information on the happenings within Waverley Tennis and I do sincerely thank Ian Chanter, Tina Feely and Delyth Samuel in keeping these communication channels up and running.

Waverley Tennis has remained as a volunteer organisation in 2022-2023 but will only continue to remain as such if volunteers come forward from Clubland and offer their services to the Tennis Association.

I commend to you this year's Annual Report.

You will read in the Annual Report the various contributions from all sectors of Waverley Tennis, and I believe that you will agree with me when I again state how fortunate that we have all been to have such a wide range of activities and under the administration of such dedicated convenors.

I would be very pleased if you would share the Annual Report around within your Committees and your Club members in order that a full appreciation is gained on the wonderful work carried out by our administrative team over the past year. More copies are available if required.

The tennis facilities (9 clay courts and extensive clubrooms) administered by Waverley Tennis at the Robinson Reserve Tennis Centre (viz., Doveton Tennis Club) have again served Waverley Tennis admirably over the past year, being its headquarters, the venue for Seasonal Weekend Grand Finals, Mid-Week Ladies' Division Grand Finals, Mid-Week Men's Grand Finals, the Junior Development Squad Program (under Lyn Gillen's administration), and all Committee/Special meetings and functions. My fervent hope in leaving Waverley Tennis is that Waverley Tennis will continue to prosper and meet all the future challenges that will arise to any sporting organisation in the years ahead - go tennis!!!

I have great confidence that Waverley Tennis will continue to strive to provide viable and attractive tennis formats and tennis opportunities for all players, parents and supporters to enjoy our great game.

It has been a great pleasure to have again served Waverley Tennis as President in 2022-2023.

## 05 WEEKEND COMPETITION

The past year has seen team numbers return to near pre – COVID figures.

Two significant trends have occurred in recent seasons.

- Sunday junior team numbers have grown so that team numbers are now approaching those of Saturday.
- Team numbers continue to grow significantly in the open senior singles/doubles rubbers format at the expense of team numbers for our traditional mixed and mens doubles rubbers sections.

With the decline of teams in the latter formats, it has created difficulty in making some sections, particularly in the top and bottom sections, of an even standard which resulted in the need to run 4 team sections at times which has not always been welcomed by some clubs. This downward trend in doubles rubbers teams has been occurring back prior to Covid-19 restrictions and has been raised with clubs for discussion at all recent Council and Match Committee Meetings with little club feedback.

Accordingly, the Match Committee made the decision to combine the mens and mixed sections into an open format with the winter season traditionally receiving a lower number of teams. Team numbers have again fallen in the current winter season with the new format with some clubs and in particular female players choosing not to play. Some clubs have advised it is easier to get suitable emergency players now and others have advised that it gives female players less interest in participating. Interestingly, number of team forfeits to date in doubles sections has reduced.

All clubs have recently been issued a questionnaire seeking their opinion on their preferred format for senior doubles rubbers for the summer season and whether our original rubbers/sets format be reconsidered. Clubs have also been reminded that it is up to number of team entries which formats will be run in the future. Without more entries for mixed or mens teams, these sections are less viable to run.

The UT Rating system is a significant issue for many of senior and junior players in our various competitions and continues to be a huge challenge to both Waverley Tennis and for our Record Secretaries.

Many players and parents have regular communication with our various Record Secretaries advising of incorrect recording of various information on match results entered on TROLS each week. These issues can include incorrect spelling of names, wrong scores or perhaps a match which one player forfeits but no notation on the UT result being entered in the comments section of scoresheet. All these issues can affect a player's UTR rating even though one match result out of many will have little effect on a player rating.

The frequency of issues raised causes considerable unnecessary additional work for our Record Secretaries if care is not taken to correctly enter results. Clubs are reminded of the importance of full names and correct spelling of players names being entered online and scoresheets being easily readable. The importance of completing a scoresheet for every match is vital and players names are shown in a readable manner to assist accuracy of recording results is vital.

## 05 WEEKEND COMPETITION (Cont.)

It has also been noted with some concern that since the new rating system has been introduced both the number of matches where a player retires hurt or ill during a match due to injury or illness has increased. Even though a player forfeits a match on TROLS, for UT purposes the result does not count and so there is some concern when a player who is losing a match decides not to continue.

Another concern is that a UTR rating still applies when a male player competes against a female player. No response to these issues has been received to date from UT.

For team grading purposes in both our senior and junior competitions, our primary criteria remains with previous competition player performance although with new teams to Waverley Tennis or in the highest grades, such ratings will be considered.

During late April, 8 senior teams represented our association in the Tennis Victoria State League Championships held at various venues with 122 teams overall participating. Although none of our teams won their respective sections, overall feedback was very positive.

Once again, our dedicated team of Record Secretaries performed their roles in a most professional manner throughout the year. Thank you to Margaret Quigley, Tina Feely and David Kimberley, all who have been performing their roles for a long period of time; and also to David for his work as Team Registrar.

In addition, much administrative work is performed behind the scenes with ordering and issue of trophies and scorebooks, organising grand final arrangements each season and dealing with protests and complaints received from clubs. All involve considerable time, care, and expertise.

A big thank you to Mark Collins, Ian Chanter, Olivia Ross, George Mitsas, Lindsay Coster and David Hocking who all made significant contributions to our ongoing success with our various competition activities.

Whilst a subject I would prefer not to have to comment, of concern is the increasing number of complaints being received of poor player behaviour and attitude to opponents, parental behaviour or interference in matches and complaints in relation to standard of Junior venue supervision. It is most disappointing and frustrating to be regularly advised of such activities.

Clubs are reminded that in the event of a problem occurring during a match which is unable to be resolved between the teams/players involved or a disagreement over a By-Law or tennis rule, our Hotline is available to seek assistance which hopefully can avoid some of these situations escalating and avoid a long drawn-out complaint. PLEASE ENSURE ALL JUNIOR SUPERVISORS ARE MADE AWARE OF THIS.

It is also vital that a person who is a Junior Supervisor is given adequate instruction on what duties they are expected to do and be prepared to listen to a visiting teams query with due respect.

It has again been a pleasure to have been your Match Convenor over the past 12 months and I thank all clubs and officials for your support and assistance.

## 06 HOT SHOTS MATCH PLAY

Hot Shots Match Play competition is held on Sunday mornings each term, featuring green and orange ball competitions. It is designed to provide young players (and their parents) with their first experiences of inter-club competition on a semi-formal basis and with modified rules and shortened playing formats over shorter seasons.

The competition was successfully run in all terms but team entries remain down on pre-COVID numbers. Each term finishes with finals, a sausage sizzle and presentation of medallions and certificates to each player.

Around 15% of the clubs entering junior teams in Waverley competition participate in the Hot Shots Match Play competition. It is good to see the way some clubs use this as an established pathway for juniors into their club and competition teams with coaches playing an important part in identifying the players ready to participate. It would be good to see more clubs giving it a try.

Over the four terms we had totals of 20 Orange Ball and 46 Orange Ball teams competing, a total of 167 players.

A big thankyou to Noble Community Tennis for Club for hosting the end of season BBQ's and presentations each term.

Thanks also to all the club co-ordinators running the program at their clubs, your support is most welcome.

### Frank Sedgman Cup for 11 & unders

2022 Frank Sedgman Cup was held in Bairnsdale on Saturday 30 July and Sunday 31 July, 2022.

Twelve teams from metropolitan and country regions travelled to Bairnsdale to play a round robin against teams from across Victoria. After winning our 3 matches in Group B on Day One (16 sets-104 games) we progressed to the semi-finals defeating Bayside Regional 5-34 to 1-15. We then went on to win the final against Eastern Region 5-34 to 1-21. A very exciting weekend for our team.

Stephen Kaldawi (our Waverley Team coach) came along to support our team. He was a member of the Inaugural Frank Sedgman Cup Event which was played in Bendigo in 2006. Waverley won the event in 2008 and 2009 - so 13 years since our last win.

### The 66th Pat Pearce Carnival

This event was hosted by Waverley Tennis at Doveton from Friday 30 September to Sunday 2 October 2022. Teams from ERT, NSJTA, NEJTA and Waverley competed. Weather was lovely.

On Tuesday 20 September Evan White from NEJTA rang me to advise that his Association was unable to field a team due to lots of factors and they would be withdrawing. I said I would contact Craig James to see if Bayside could help them fill their gaps which they did. Prior to and during the event NEJTA had only 3/8 girls left in their team. Bayside helped again with 2 players, NSJTA with 2, ERT with one. In the boys 1 x 15 and under boy from Shepparton was injured on day one and was replaced with a Waverley boy. We had to dispense with the age criteria as we just needed bodies on court. One of their boys also came from Bayside. I called them the ALL STARS team. They all got on well and enjoyed the experience.

ERT had 2 change of orders in singles before the event.

NSJTA had a change of order in the 15 girls, and also an injury in boys 15s which created changes of order even shifting from 13s to 15s plus a new player on Sunday to replace an injured boy in the 13s.

Waverley - there were no changes. They must have been scared of me and turned up each day with no replacements required - thank goodness.

# 13 VICE PRESIDENT'S REPORT

A considerable amount of my time on the committee this year has been on Universal Tennis and working with the other Associations that use TROLS (twelve in total) to agree an MOU with UTR for the ongoing upload of weekly match results to the UTR platform, so they are included in players' UTRs.

This has taken considerable time to navigate to agree acceptable terms, and we are not there yet. Member clubs should note that of the twelve associations that use TROLS for weekly competition results, seven are continuing with negotiations: Bayside Region; Eastern Region; Metro Masters; North Eastern Junior; Waverley Tennis; Berwick & District and Moorabbin & District.

Blackburn & District Night; Diamond Valley; Heidelberg & Districts; North East Night Tennis Group (NENTG), will not proceed, although NENTG have requested that we keep them informed of discussions.

The other key activity I have been involved with is running Flex Leagues.

These have been very popular and have grown to consistently attract over 100 players per league, from all around Melbourne. They provide a good



complement for players wanting extra matches or players that can't commit to weekly competition. Importantly, they also provide a good revenue stream for the Association.

Finally, Waverley Tennis was fortunate to secure funding via Club Map to run a strategic planning workshop. These workshops took place in March and April and highlighted the need for Waverley Tennis to do things differently to ensure our sustainability as an organisation. With Mark stepping down (from multiple roles), this work is more important than ever.

Again, I would love to hear from anyone that has skills and time they can contribute to both the competition operations and the junior development activities of Waverley Tennis.

# 15 TREASURER'S REPORT

Operating income has increased significantly for 2022/23 following last year's initial recovery from the Covid-19 lock down in 2021. Whilst competition income grew strongly, tournaments and the introduction of Universal Tennis were very important in seeing Operating Income grow to \$201,631, an increase of 50%.

Operating cost increases were incurred with Competitions and Tournaments but favourably percentagewise. Outright expense increases with Team Events, Robinson Reserve Venue, Equipment purchases, and Development/Promotion expenses, also applied.

Whilst Honoraria show an expense increase, this is primarily because of under accrual for the expenses in previous years.

The final outcome of a small loss, following the growth in income, is traced primarily to catch-up on depreciation charges, the write-off of some old clothing stock and increases in accrued expenditure.

Introduction of the Newcombe Tennis Camp visit project, whilst supported with a development grant of \$5,000 from Waverley Tennis, is designed to be self-funding with parent contribution and various fundraising projects. The balance sheet reports the cash held at year end for the project as a current asset, matched by an equal reserve liability.

Waverley Tennis continues to be indebted to its major supporters including –

- City of Casey in connection with the Robinson Reserve venue;
- Community Bank Pinewood - Bendigo Bank – Sponsorship of the major AMT event at Nottingham Pinewood in November;
- Wilson Sporting Goods & Tension 24 for tennis balls and performance awards;
- and the many Handbook advertisers.

At this time, there is ever increasing pressure on volunteers, Waverley Tennis is feeling this, and we observe it also with many clubs seeking new committee representation. If you can 'put your hand up' at our AGM it will be most welcome. We believe it is an increasingly worthy cause for Waverley Tennis to be well run to support tennis clubs and their club members to achieve physical and mental "happiness". Mayo Clinic researchers found that tennis players, more than other sporting activities, statistically live longer & healthier lives.

Please help us to efficiently communicate with your committee by advising us of correct contact details and by ensuring that your Waverley Tennis website Club Zone details are updated when you have committee member changes. ## **SCOPE**

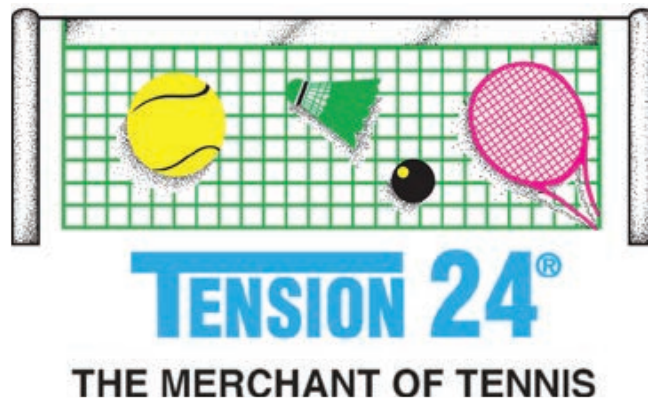
