Waverley Tennis G Series teams. tennis. connection.

- The **Waverley Tennis G Series** is a term-based competition created for female tennis players who want to play competitive tennis in a format that feels social, supportive, and team-driven.
- It is designed to be competitive, welcoming, and fun — a place where female players can build friendships and enjoy tennis in a format that fits the rhythm of the school term.
- Launching as a pilot in Term 4, the G Series brings together players nominated by Waverley Tennis member clubs into **six teams of four players**, to compete on five Sunday afternoons in the **Waverley Tennis triples competition format**.
- A final Sunday afternoon will see all players come together to compete individually in an 8-player compass draw competition and include presentations and prizes for teams and individuals.

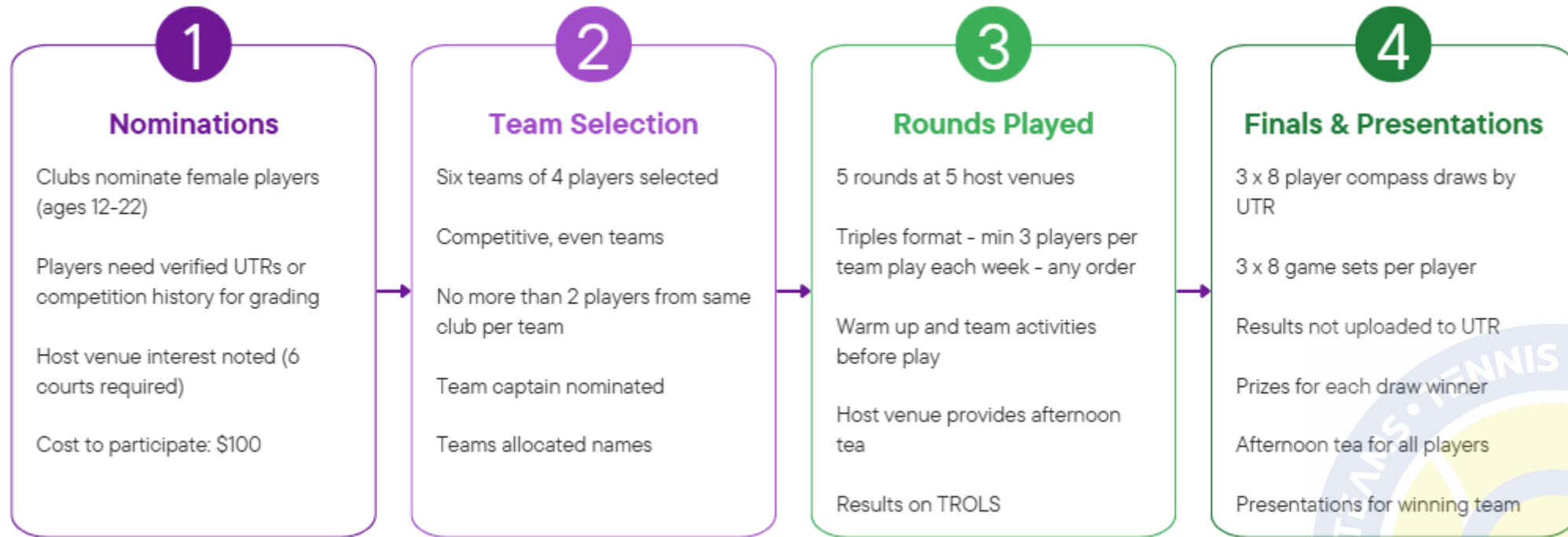


How it works

- Each week, all six teams come together at a **single host venue**, creating a vibrant, shared match-day atmosphere across **six courts**.
- Across five weeks of round-robin competition, players experience a blend of:
 - **supervised warm-up**
 - **team building exercises**
 - **structured match play**
 - **peer networking**, and
 - **community building**.
- After play each week, everyone comes together for **afternoon tea**, strengthening the social fabric that sits at the heart of the series.
- The season culminates in a final round, featuring three **8-player compass draws** and ladder **presentations**, celebrating both individual performance and team success.

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How to Get Involved in the Waverley Tennis G Series

For Clubs & Coaches



1. Nominate Your Players

- Submit nominations for female players aged **12–22**.
- Ensure each player has a **verified UTR or past competition experience to assist with team composition**.
- Confirm players are available for the **Term 4 pilot** and/or **Term 1 2027**.
- Indicate if your club wishes to be a **host venue** (requires **6 courts** on Sunday afternoons).

2. Support Team Formation

- A Selection Committee will create **six teams of four**, aiming for balanced, competitive squads.
- No more than **two players from the same club** will be placed in a team.
- Team #1 player becomes default **team captain**.

3. Confirm Player Payments

- **Advise that players will pay individually** once selected and Waverley Tennis will invoice them.
- Note: clubs may choose to sponsor player participation and pay the invoice from Waverley Tennis on their behalf. This is at the club's discretion.

4. Optional: Host a Round

- Indicate willingness to be a host club and that you can:
- Provide **six courts** (2 per match).
- Have an experienced venue supervisor **available for the afternoon of the competition**.
- Supply **afternoon tea** for all players.
- For this, your club will be paid a **\$300 hosting payment** (on receipt of invoice).

How to Get Involved in the Waverley Tennis G Series

For Female Players (12-22)



1. Nominate Through Your Club

- Let your club know you want to be part of the **Waverley Tennis G Series**.
- Ensure you provide good information about **competition experience** to assist with grading.
- Confirm you're available for **Sunday afternoons (1–4pm)** during Term 4 and/or Term 1 2027.

2. Team Selection

- A Selection Committee will place you into one of **six teams**, aiming for even competition and a fun, social mix of players from different clubs.
- **If selected**, you'll confirm your place by paying the **competition fee**.
- **If not selected** we will aim to select you for Term 1 2027 competition.

3. Play the Season

- Enjoy **five rounds** of Waverley Tennis triples, with all teams playing at the **same venue each week**.
- All four players participate each week (with flexibility for absences).
- Share **afternoon tea** (provided by the host club) with all teams — a signature part of the G Series culture.

4. Finals Week (6th week)

- Compete in **8-player compass draws** based on your UTR (after 5 rounds).
- Prizes awarded for each draw winner and the **overall winning team players**.
- Finals and presentations held at **Notting Hill Pinewood**.

Member Clubs' Role

- Let their female players know that this competition is available for female players aged 12-22 of any UTR or with previous competition experience
- Nominate female players who are interested to play (advise \$100 per player fee)
- Make sure nominated players know that they may not be selected if we can't place them in a competitive team for the upcoming term
- Let them know we will prioritise different players for Term 1 2027



Host Venues' Role

- Provide 6 courts and clubroom facilities for their nominated round
- Keep courts available for spare week round in case of wash out
- Provide an experienced junior venue supervisor (with current WWCC)
- Allocate courts to teams
- Manage any on court queries
- Assist with the completion of match scorecards and send them to the competition convenor by Monday 7pm
- Coordinate provision of afternoon tea for all players

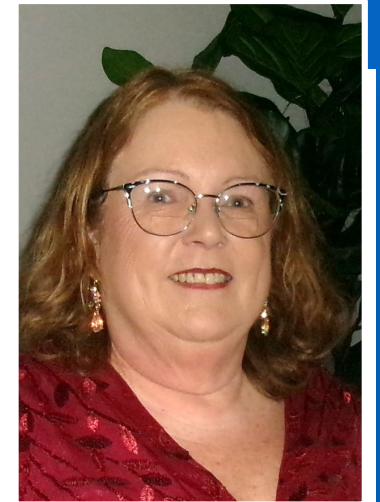
Waverley Tennis G Series Convenor

- Coordinate team selection process to ensure 6 competitive teams each term
- Chair selection committee process (Chair Marcos Ahumada)
- Invoice players who are selected
- Upload competition round results on TROLS
- Provide competition balls
- Pays club that host a round
- Organise compass draw, presentations and prizes



Waverley Tennis has appointed Toni Peters as G Series competition convenor and records secretary, and she will:

- Coordinate the whole competition
- Liaise with TROLS on competition set up and key dates
- Liaise with Chair of selection committee
- Liaise with host venues
- Enter scores on TROLS
- Assist with organising substitute players where teams have less than 3 players
- Promote the competition
- Provide draw, presentations and prizes



Frequently Asked Questions



Question	Answer
What UTR/UTR range are you looking for?	There is no specific range. For the pilot we are looking for any players who are interested to play. What's more important is to have enough interested players that we can create 6 competitive teams that are roughly equal in ability. For players without a UTR, past competition experience should be provided.
How will you prioritise player selection?	Selection will be focussed on creating 6 competitive teams. We will also prioritise players from clubs that don't have enough female players to create all female teams in Waverley weekend competition.
What happens if a player is not selected?	Players who are not selected for the pilot round will be prioritised for any subsequent rounds
Why is the minimum age 12?	We think players under this age can play open triple competition at club level. If wanting to play a girls only competition, then we also offer Saturday morning girls sections.
Why is the maximum age 22?	We wanted to be able to offer an all-female competition to players who are no longer eligible to play junior competition, want to keep playing and have limited other options
Why is the entry fee \$100 per player?	The entry fee needs to cover the direct costs of paying clubs for the use of their venues (and them providing afternoon teas), the cost of competition balls, and any prizes and trophies. Covering direct costs means the competition can be run again if successful.

Frequently Asked Questions



Question	Answer
How many players play each week	3 or 4 players can play each week (we want all 4 players to play, but understand sometimes there are other commitments or injuries). The Waverley Tennis triples format allows more than 3 players to play, and gives teams a little bit more flexibility.
What order do players play in?	Each team will have players ordered from 1 to 4 at the time of player selection and team creation. However, this competition format allows player order to change. Doing this means that players can get a combination of both singles and doubles rubber during the competition.
What is the format of the last week?	This will be a compass draw with 8 players in three groups and is an individual event. They will play 3 “matches” (expected to be 8 game sets with a set tiebreak at 7 all). There will be presentations for the competition ladder positions as well as the three compass draws, as well as afternoon tea. Results from this final week are not uploaded to UTR.
What happens if a round is washed out?	The first week that is fully washed out (e.g. no play at all) will use the spare week and the venue from the washed out week to play. If more than one is fully washed out, the points from the second (and any washout) will be scored as a draw for the ladder.
What happens if the final week is washed out?	We will use the spare finals week (if applicable). If no play is possible, all players are still expected to attend for presentations.
Who do I contact if I can't play for any reason?	In the first instance, you contact your nominated Team Captain. They will let the Competition Convenor know that your team is a player short. If you still have 3 players, there is no change, but if you only have 2 players, then the Competition Convenor will organise an emergency player from one of the other teams to play for your team.
